**FEDERAL COURT UPHOLDS RULING IN FAVOR OF MJ SOLUTIONS GmbH, CONTINUES
PERMANENT INJUNCTION PROHIBITING ARKWRIGHT'S PRODUCTION OF IMAGE TRANSFER
MEDIA FOR DARK FABRICS**

MINNEAPOLIS, MN (June 10, 2015) – UPDATE – A December 2014 ruling by the American Arbitration Association's International Center for Dispute Resolution (ICDR) in the case ARKWRIGHT ADVANCED COATING, INC v. MJ SOLUTIONS GmbH has been upheld by the United States District Court for the District Minnesota.

Arkwright Advanced Coating, Inc, which has sold image transfer media under its own name and under the names of Sihl, Inc., Sihl USA and Sihl Digital Imaging, ("Arkwright") challenged the original arbitration award, seeking to overturn the ruling which placed a permanent injunction on production and sale of image transfer media intended for use with dark fabrics in addition to a monetary award addressing past due payments on a license agreement between Arkwright and MJ Solutions GmbH (MJS).

The United States District Court for the District of Minnesota confirmed the terms of the award in all respects and entered judgment against Arkwright in federal court in Minneapolis. The judgment includes a permanent injunction prohibiting Arkwright from making, using, offering to sell or selling its image transfer media for dark fabrics.

Patent law allows for patent holders to enforce at all levels of the supply chain. This ruling, together with a recent patent interference ruling involving other image transfer media patents owned by Jodi Schwendimann, supports the strength of MJS and Schwendimann's patents, which are currently licensed exclusively by NuCoat. These rulings also demonstrate that MJS and Schwendimann can enforce their patents against any party that makes, uses, sells or offers to sell image transfer media that infringes on their patents.
